

I have gotten a lot of feedback from this eBook & many readers have confirmed that, yes, "this eBook helped them make money".

However, one thing that is also true, some readers *failed* to make money. The percentage of such users is much lower, but these people do exist.

But in the beginning, even *an hour a day* is good enough to help you get started. As long as that hour is spent productively, you will be learning more and more as time progresses.

The more time you spend learning about affiliate marketing and its complementary skills (*like managing a virtual team*), the more it is **guaranteed** to be fruitful for you in coming days.

#### But you will find that learning all of this is fun!

There's no need for head scratching because I will be helping you out with **detailed tutorials & guides** for complementing your learning. I will also be sending you out emails for further understanding in the coming days.

Before we start, to clear up doubt, check out what previous readers have said after applying the techniques mentioned in this eBook:

# What is Affiliate Marketing?

Affiliate marketing is the coolest way to earn money from blogging or online marketing. Once you have done the hard work, you will be earning money even when you are **sleeping** (or scuba diving in Bali).



From a technical perspective, here is the definition:

Affiliate marketing is one of the oldest forms of marketing:

-Affiliates recommend products & when someone purchases those products, affiliates earn a portion of the sale.

You have probably seen this business model in the real-estate business. In today's era, where almost everything is digital, the same form of business conducted online is called "affiliate marketing".

You can earn anywhere from \$1 to \$10,000 depending on what products you are promoting and recommending. The reason affiliate marketing is so lucrative is because once you have done the **basic work** of putting your content online, creating a system, driving traffic, etc., the money will keep flowing in.

I will discuss more on this later but for now, review this image to understand the basic model of affiliate marketing:



#### From the image:

- 1. A shopper/reader clicks on a product link on **your website**.
- 2. They land on the merchant's website.
- 3. He/she purchases the product.
- 4. You earn a portion of that sale.

You must be thinking: "How do companies know if the sale is coming from my link or from someone else's link?

#### The answer:

• A tracking link (a.k.a affiliate link)

Don't get confused with the jargon just yet. "Tracking Link" is pretty simple.

# What is a Tracking Link?

A tracking link is a **unique link** given to *only you* by the affiliate company or the product company. **This unique tracking link** is used to keep track of all the traffic you are sending (and sales you are making) via your website or other promotion channel.

A tracking link is like any other URL, but contains a *unique* string/parameter for your profile. When you join an affiliate program, you will get your tracking link from the affiliate dashboard.

Here are two examples of such tracking links:

- https://www.tubebuddy.com/Shout
- http://click.tunnelbear.com/aff c?offer id=2&aff id=1314

Yeah, I know, the 2<sup>nd</sup> tracking link in the above example **looks horrible & ugly**.

But don't worry, because **soon** you will learn how to make your *ugly links look* pretty.


These two links are *my affiliate links* for two different affiliate programs. When you join an affiliate program, you will get *your affiliate link*. All you need to do is promote those links by any method possible (legitimate methods only!) and when someone purchases the product, you will earn a commission.

When you sign up for an affiliate program, you will get a unique link similar to the examples above. Each link is personalized so the company can track your referrals.

For example:

Tubebuddy.com/Shout (my unique affiliate link)
Tubebuddy.com/somekeyword (your unique link)

TubeBuddy has an affiliate program where they pay 30% of commission/sale. You can create a free account <u>& get your affiliate links from here.</u>



Here's another question: "What if companies don't pay or don't show a real sale as a sale?"

#### Answer:

Well, unfortunately that happens a lot of the time & this is why this
guide will help you to learn how to avoid such situations and scam affiliate
companies.

In an upcoming chapter, I will tell you about affiliate marketplaces where you can find **reliable companies**, which you can *trust* to form an authentic affiliate partnership.

(Note: Many old-fashioned affiliate programs, instead of using affiliate URLs, lets a buyer add the Email ID of referrals (i.e. you), which is also accounted for

in affiliate sales. Obviously, this is not the best way to track progress. More on that later.)

Alright, things get interesting from here:

There are **many ways** for you to join an affiliate program. In this eBook, I will discuss the *two most popular* & effective ways to join affiliate programs.

- 1. Joining an **affiliate marketplace**
- 2. Joining a direct affiliate program
  - a. (Tricks on finding such programs in a later chapter)

Websites that sell products online, such as Amazon, Shopify, GoPro, or any online service, *usually* offer an affiliate program. When you sign up for their affiliate program (*free*), you gain access to their affiliate dashboard & there you can find *your unique tracking link*.

In a later section of this eBook, I will share tricks to discover affiliate programs in **every niche**.

Here are some of the popular promotion methods used by affiliate marketers:

- Blogging or Content Marketing
- YouTube videos
- PPC Marketing (Facebook ads, AdWords ads)
- Buying paid traffic
- Email Marketing
- Creating a 'coupon & deals' website
- Creating Cashback websites like CashKaro

Note: I have shared tricks to find more of these affiliate programs later in this eBook. Keep reading!

Every affiliate program has their set Terms of Standards (TOS).

For example, many of them offer a **60-day cookie period**. That means if a visitor uses your affiliate link to land on a company's page and they don't buy anything immediately, they can buy the product within **the next 60 days** (on the same device) and you *will still earn the affiliate commission*.

You can read the technical description of <u>cookies here at Wikipedia</u>.

#### Another interesting thing to know:

• You will get paid for *other product purchases*.

For example, if your reader goes to Amazon.com using your affiliate link & he/she purchases **another product which you haven't recommended**, you will still get the *same commission out of that sale*.

This is yet *another reason* that affiliate marketing is so lucrative.

**Pro Tip:** Most companies *require* you to have a blog or a website for becoming their affiliate partner. This helps them to get serious people, and helps you because having your own blog/website is **one of the best ways** to make an affiliate sale.

You can get the <u>ShoutMeLoud WordPress eBook</u> to learn how to set up your blog/website yourself without paying money to hire a developer.


# A Glossary of Affiliate Marketing Terms:

Now, let's understand some of the common terminologies in the affiliate marketing industry. You will be reading & hearing these words **every time** you learn *anything* about "Affiliate Marketing" or "Digital Marketing".

- **Affiliates:** Publishers (like you and me) who join an affiliate program.
- Affiliate Marketplace: This is a marketplace where you can find numerous companies offering affiliate programs for their product(s). There are many marketplaces (like <a href="ShareASale">ShareASale</a>, Commission Junction, JvZoo, ClickBank, etc.), which work as a central database for affiliate programs in different niches. This one is important, as using the above sites will help you find affiliate programs for your niche. I have detailed more about the above mentioned marketplaces in a further section of this "Affiliate Marketing Handbook"
- **Affiliate Software:** Software used by companies to create an in-house affiliate program for their product. This is not so important at this stage, but it's good to know about. Ex: <u>iDevaffiliate</u>, HasOffers.
- **Affiliate Link:** Unique tracking link offered by your affiliate program to track the progress of your affiliate promotion. (We have already discussed this term earlier.)
- Affiliate ID: This is similar to an affiliate link, but a little different. In some cases, many affiliate programs offer a "unique ID" which you can then add to any page of the product site (example: productpage.com/AffiliateID).
- Payment Mode/Method: Different affiliate programs offer different methods of payment. Common payment modes include: Check, Wire transfer, PayPal, Payoneer, and many others.
  - PayPal: This is most common payment method to receiving affiliate earnings. You need to create a PayPal account if you don't already have one. You can follow this guide to create your account. Companies will send you payment to PayPal & from PayPal it will be transferred to your bank account.
  - Payoneer: This is another payment program that you will be using to receive affiliate commissions. Payoneer offers a Master

- Card and you can use it as a *debit card*. You can also transfer money from Payoneer to your bank account. <u>You can join</u> Payoneer here.
- Wire transfer: Many companies offer direct deposit & whenever possible, you should prefer this method as this will *save you a lot of money*. When you use PayPal or Payoneer, you will be paying a small amount as a service charge. With wire transfer (ACH), you will *not be paying any service fees*.
- **Check:** I know it's funny to hear that some companies do not offer digital payment. One of these companies, <u>Aweber</u> (popular email-marketing system), offers affiliate payment via paper check only. I personally find this stupid, but at times, we can't do much but follow the company's guidelines to get paid.
- Affiliate Manager: When you join an affiliate program (directly or using a marketplace), there is always an affiliate manager associated with it. Affiliate managers are central to many things. You should always build a good relationship with your affiliate managers. They will help you to get increased commissions and give you a heads-up about new offers.
- Commission Percentage/Amount: The amount or percentage of commission you will be getting for every sale via your affiliate link. Many companies offer fixed percentages of the sale amount (Ex: 30%) & many others offer fixed rates per sale (Ex: \$25).
- Two Tier Affiliate Marketing: This is a great way of making money from an affiliate program. In this, you recommend others to join a particular affiliate program, and you will get a commission when your subaffiliates make sales. This is like MLM (multi-level marketing), but in a totally legit way. This is also popularly known as Sub-Affiliate Commissions.
- Landing Page: A unique product sales or demo page which is used to increase sales. The purpose of the landing page is to direct *traffic to take a desired action*. It could be as simple as *subscribing to your email newsletter* or *buying a product*. You can learn more when I finish my next eBook on email marketing, but for now you need to know that *landing pages are very useful*. You can use software like <a href="LeadPages">LeadPages</a> to create a professional landing page.

- Custom/Special Affiliate Offer: Many companies usually have special offers for their affiliate partners who are giving them a good amount of sales. These affiliates are called "Super Affiliates". You should focus on being one of them.
- **Link Cloaking:** Most affiliate tracking links are ugly. Link cloaking allows you to turn ugly looking links into easily readable and attractive links. I have shared the *complete tutorial* on link cloaking in a later part of this eBook.
- **Custom Coupons:** Many programs let affiliates create custom coupons, which is *also used to track sales*. Also, custom discount coupons help you *increase* affiliate sales. If you are giving a good number of sales to any particular merchant, you can always ask affiliate managers to give you an *exclusive coupon code*. This also helps in the *branding* of your service/blog/website.



Advertising/Affiliate Marketing Terms:

In the below section you will learn some *more terms* which are related to advertising within the affiliate industry.

Understanding these terms will help you to pick the **right affiliate offers** from various networks.

- **EPC** (**earning per click**): This is calculated by taking the amount of clicks divided by the commission earned.
- **CPC** (**cost per click**): The *actual price* you pay per click. This is a common term when running PPC campaigns using AdWords or Facebook advertising.
- **CR (conversion rate):** Conversions divided by clicks. This gives you an idea of how your ad campaigns are performing.

Note: An online company gets benefit from an affiliate program, as this is one of the best ways to get free promotion and save on advertising.

It also benefits the affiliate.

Whenever you see coupons or discounted products offered via links, most of the time, these links are affiliate links. When you make a purchase, webmasters make money.

It's a win-win-win scenario!

Don't be shy to use other's affiliate links, as they have worked hard to educate you on something. By using their affiliate link, **you are rewarding them**. You will understand this better once you start working on content generation & educating your audience.

# What You Need to Get Started with Affiliate Marketing:

I will now share with you all the important topics to become a **master of affiliate marketing.** But first, let's take some *baby steps* which will help you to get the basics down right from start.

One can begin affiliate marketing using any form of digital marketing.

Examples of affiliate websites:

- Blog which educates readers
- Coupon based site
- Product comparison site
- Niche Amazon site (designed specifically for Amazon affiliate earnings)

#### Other techniques:

- PPC marketing (via Facebook ads or Google AdWords)
- Email marketing
  - o typically used with blogging or PPC but can be done separately

Note: These are some popular methods used by affiliate marketers. Do remember, it's not limited to only what's listed above. Once you master this course, you are free to discover your own mediums for affiliate marketing.

I prefer educating users & recommending products **that I personally use** or have used in the past. Once you have learned the in's & out's of affiliate marketing, you can use any of the ways mentioned above (or many other ways) to start making money.

Typically, **I suggest blogging** because you will not only be making money, you will also be *making a name for yourself*. That's more of my personal choice, but whatever method you use is ultimately a decision you should be completely happy with.

#### Tips for non-writers:

If you are not into content writing, you should consider using other forms of promotional methods other than blogging.

But if you want to create a blog and don't want to write, a good work around is **hiring a content writer** from sites like <u>ContentMart</u>, <u>TextBroker</u> or <u>PeoplePerHour</u>.

My only suggestion is **don't promote anything that you would not recommend to your loved ones**. Ex: Sketchy poker site or untested health related products.

Again, this is a decision you need to make based on your own moral conscience.

# Link Cloaking: Your new best friend



Link cloaking, in simple words, means making long affiliate URLs into shorter and prettier ones. We do this for multiple reasons.

#### **Ugly URL into Pretty URL:**

Usually affiliate links you get from your affiliate programs are pretty ugly. They are usually a long strand of numbers, letters, and symbols. Link cloaking turns these long, confusing, ugly links into short, concise, good-looking links.

This technique can also add your brand name into the URL which makes it more trustworthy and further brands you as a reputable source.

#### Here's an example:

#### Affiliate URL:

http://www.semrush.com/billing/offers/buy/4kprox41?promo=SHOUTMELOU D-R4EQ4OIZ

#### **Affiliate Cloaked URL:**

http://affiliatemarketing.buzz/go/SEMRUSH/

#### **Search Engine Ranking:**

One of the major concerns with affiliate marketers is search engine ranking. Most affiliate marketers miss out on optimizing their blog and fail to ensure that their blog is SEO friendly.

Cloaking your URLs helps optimize your site.

#### **Changing Future URLs:**

At times, your product company may change their affiliate software which requires you to change your affiliate URLs *everywhere*. When you are using a link cloaking solution, you can change *all URLs with a single click*.

• **Pro Tip**: Whenever I add a link to any product which doesn't yet have an affiliate program, I still **cloak the normal URL** so that in the future I can easily update the URL with an affiliate link when it becomes available. Just using this technique helped me earn thousands of dollars extra/month.

#### Affiliate URLs are banned on many sites:

On many popular sites such as Facebook, or even using PPC on Google, affiliate URLs are **banned**. Link cloaking helps you eradicate this issue.

#### **Links to Link Cloaking:**

- If you are using the WordPress platform for your blog or website, you can use this popular plugin: ThirstyAffiliate WordPress plugin.
- For any other platform you <u>can use the Geni.us website</u>.

# Features To Look For in an Affiliate Program:

In the past 8 years, I have been an affiliate with **almost 90 direct affiliate programs**. Every one of them is different in their own way.

They all differ in affiliate policies, payouts, commissions, and their affinity towards affiliates like you & me.

I'm going to list down some of the features that will make your affiliate journey easier.

If you are joining a direct affiliate program & any of the below listed features are not available, you can always **ask your affiliate manager** to add the feature.

Let's start with #1.

# Payment Method:

When you are starting out with affiliate marketing, I suggest you ignore all the fancy features, *and focus on payment method*.

This is particularly true in Asian countries, where many users have shown concerns due to the *limited functionalities* of popular services like PayPal and <u>Payoneer</u>.

You should ensure that the company offers a payment method that you can use to receive payment. In some situations, payment via check may be recommended.

• **Pro Tip:** If PayPal or Payoneer is the *only way* to receive payment, you should partner with another blogger or online marketer (who is trustworthy) & ask them to receive payment on your behalf in return for a 10-15% commission.

#### Tasks for this section:

- 1. Create a <u>PayPal account</u> if you don't have one.
- 2. Create a <u>Payoneer account</u> if you don't have one.
- 3. Create a bank account in your city which accepts payment in different

currencies. Once you have that bank account, you can use <u>Evernote</u> (or any other note taking app) to keep the following information handy:

- Bank Name:
- Address:

Update: Most companies including (Amazon, CJ.com, ShareASale) now offer direct bank deposit.

# Single product affiliate link: (Deep linking)

Imagine you sign up for an affiliate program with a lot of products and you can't find a *direct affiliate link* to an individual product. This could be very annoying for you.

It's important for every affiliate program to offer individual links to specific products.


If a possible buyer lands on a homepage instead of a product sales page, most likely they will move somewhere else. Do you want to lose a sale just because of one little feature? Most of the affiliate programs in 2016 have this feature, but in case it's not there, reach out to your affiliate manager and request it.

# Custom link option:

Following up from the above point, pricing pages would not be considered a "product page". But sometimes, in order to **showcase the product** (as on a blog or review site), you might *want to link to a pricing page*. Using a direct link in this case will be a *big mistake* and will cause you to lose out on a lot of potential sales.

How about an option to create a **custom link** for **any page** using your affiliate URL?

This feature is something which the <u>Elegant Themes affiliate program</u> offers. (See below screenshot for clarity)



# Custom discount coupon code:

Discount coupon codes are **one of the best** methods to promoting *any product*, as it **encourages** sales. Most affiliate programs, especially hosting affiliates, offer discount coupons. You can always use *their* code, but wouldn't it be better to create your **own branded discount coupon code?** 

For example, here's a custom discount coupon code for my HostGator Hosting affiliate account: **SHOUTMELOUD30 (for 30% off)** 

(This discount code helps me to get about \$520/month in extra affiliate sales.)

Apart from offering discounts, such coupon codes help in branding. Very few affiliate products offer an option to create custom discount coupons, but an option like this is **incredibly useful** for affiliate marketers like us. Don't you agree?

• **Pro Tip:** If you are referring more than 2 sales a month, you should ask your program's affiliate manager to create an exclusive coupon for you.

Some affiliate managers are **really nice people** and will even provide you with a *custom landing page*.

You can see an example here where HostGator created a specific landing page for ShoutMeLoud.



# Email updates:

So now you are a part of one of the top selling products as an affiliate promoter and the company is currently running a **great deal or offer** which nobody can refuse.

But you only got to know about it after 10 other bloggers have already written about it and the promotion is coming to an end.

Make sure you are subscribed to the product affiliate newsletter or ping the affiliate manager to add you to the affiliate email list.

Alternatively, you should also *subscribe to product updates*, FB pages, Twitter pages, or any other ways in which you can stay updated with the latest happenings about the product.

### Affiliate stats and banners:

So you just joined an affiliate program.

You log into your affiliate console area and you realize that there is **nothing** apart from your affiliate link and an "edit profile" option.

You can't track how many hits you are sending to them or which page or promotional method is working best for you.

Moreover, there is no offering of any promotional banners or links.

#### How annoying!

For me, I might refuse to work with such affiliate programs and will find another similar (and equally good) product. *Having a fully-fledged affiliate panel* is important for any successful affiliate program.

Note: At times when a new product is launched, integrating affiliate programs can be a challenge for companies. They will give you a unique link but can't provide an affiliate dashboard. Sometime it's OK to make an exception & let the sales flow naturally.

The only thing that I wouldn't do here is pro-actively promote the product. After all, I'm unsure if I'll be getting paid for my efforts.

# How To Select the Best Affiliate Product for Your Blog:

To be a successful affiliate marketer, you need to pick, and promote, the **right product** on your blog.

76% of newbie affiliate marketers fail to earn *any money* from affiliate marketing because they *never pick the right product* to promote.

Having success in affiliate marketing is not easy, but it's also not that hard. You need to be persistent, consistent, and have a **proper marketing plan**. If you do these three things, you *will be successful* in affiliate marketing.

Some of the factors that define whether you succeed or fail are:

- What affiliate products you are promoting?
- What medium you are using to promote them?
- How good is your sales funnel?
- Are you targeting the right audience?
- Do you have a plan or are you working on a 'hit or miss' strategy?

The reason **why I've earned millions** from affiliate marketing is because I only promote products that I have personally tested and used. There was a time when I promoted things without testing them. These products were not good and after *many* bad reviews, **my brand suffered**. I was lucky that this happened at the initial stage, but I had to learn this lesson the hard way.

As I mentioned earlier, I use the "education method" in order to make my living online. It's time consuming, but at the same **it's safe** & the rewards are *more consistent* and *stay consistent* for longer periods.

Writing how-to guides & tutorials definitely helps in promotion. It doesn't matter if you are the *creator or curator*, as long as you are ensuring that your target audience uses your affiliate links to purchase a product.

Soon, I will share the tricks that I personally follow to choose **only the best** products to promote.

Before we move ahead, let's recap some things we have learned in earlier sections:

- **Affiliate marketplace:** This is a marketplace where companies list their product(s) & as an affiliate, you can select which products you want to promote. Here you will see all the stats like *overall conversion rate* of a product, *how much the payout is*, and other data-based details that help you pick the best products to promote.
- Native/In-house Affiliate program: Many products have a native affiliate program. Recall the example of TubeBuddy in the first section of this eBook; that TubeBuddy program is an example of a native affiliate program.

Usually, it's beneficial to join an affiliate program via an **affiliate marketplace**, as their *tracking mechanisms are pretty strong*. You can also easily reach the minimum payout by promoting *multiple products* from the same marketplace.


By using a quality marketplace, you lower down the chances of being cheated.

### Start with an Affiliate Marketplace:

Also, the best place to **start hunting for affiliate products** is in a marketplace (like <u>ShareASale</u> or <u>Commission Junction</u>). Depending on your niche, you can find really good affiliate products to promote.

Most of these affiliate marketplaces have sections which show their most popular affiliate products.

On the next page you can see a screenshot from the ShareASale affiliate marketplace, which shows the top 100 hottest selling products:



Remember, every marketplace has a **different set of features** and layout structure. Soon I will be launching a membership site where you can get your hands on **videos for every popular affiliate marketplace**. For now, <u>ShareASale</u> is one affiliate marketplace that you should definitely join ASAP!

# The Benefits of Affiliate Marketplaces:

Affiliate Marketplaces have many benefits. Here's a quick overview.

#### All the niches in one place:

One of the major problems we face as an affiliate is finding an affiliate program that aligns with our niche. In any affiliate marketplace, you can find **many affiliate programs in various categories & niches**.

#### Easy to reach minimum payout:

When you sign-up for an affiliate program directly (in-house affiliate program), the biggest challenge is to reach the minimum payout. In an affiliate marketplace, your minimum payout is the **sum of all the affiliate programs** that you are promoting. For a beginner, it's *much easier* to reach the minimum payout in a marketplace.

#### Less chances of affiliate sale frauds:

In the past, when I joined the affiliate program of a popular online company (HostGator) with their in-house affiliate software, it was a disaster. *I had no choice* but to blog about it.

I wrote a blog post & also made a video on YouTube.

HostGator's people didn't like me making this information public, but eventually they understood the problem & moved their program to **ImpactRadius**, which offers better tracking.

At times, direct affiliate programs cannot track sales due to improper configurations of their affiliate software, a new affiliate manager, or maybe some of **them just don't want to pay you**.

With an affiliate marketplace, you don't have to worry about this problem. Their tracking mechanisms are **excellent** & you will be paid for your hard (& not so hard) work.

Examples of Affiliate Marketplace: ShareaSale, Amazon, Commision Junction etc.

If a product is not listed in the affiliate marketplace, you can directly search for that particular affiliate program. Let me explain you how:

# Join affiliate programs individually:

Most online products have their *own* **in-house affiliate programs**. One such example is the <u>DreamHost affiliate program</u>.

All you need to do is find the hottest selling products in your niche and find the opportunity to market these products.

For example, if you run a blog about dogs, you can try to find an affiliate program related to **dog food** or **dog care**.


To find these companies, you can simply use Google search with the following query:

"site:domain.com affiliate" or "(product name) + affiliate program + Country".

#### Examples:

- WordPress (Product name) + Affiliate Program
- Fashion (Niche) + Affiliate Program
- Fashion (Niche) + Affiliate Program + Country
- Site:dreamhost.com (Domain.com) + Affiliate

You can see an example of one such Google search on the next page:



These are manual searches, of course, but this works in *most cases*, especially when you are in a **niche** where it is difficult to find an affiliate product on a marketplace.

# What is a "niche affiliate" product?

You must have noticed that I have used the phrase "niche product" multiple times in this eBook so far.

Let's dive deep into this:

A **niche affiliate product** means a product *based* on your blog's topics and your blog's readers. Suppose you run a blog about health (i.e. 'the health niche'), you should be promoting a product *related to health* on your blog.

My advice for you is to **select the best selling products** in your niche and start **writing about them**. It will help you drive traffic and *boost your conversion rates*.

The difference between successful and failed affiliate campaigns are determined by **conversion rates**.

If you are getting 100 or so clicks on your affiliate campaign but a 0% or 1% conversion rate, you need to re-think your strategy.

#### One big mistake:

The most common mistake a newbie affiliate marketer makes is **spending hours of time** promoting a *low quality* product. With this approach, a marketer fails before even getting started.

• Pro Tip: Don't make this classic mistake!

What you can do instead is spend quality time learning about the product.

- Test it out yourself or read reviews by experts or authority bloggers.
- Review the previous products launched by the company.
- Take time in **finding the right product to promote**.

Don't fall into the trap of marketers who will promise tons of money and ultimately don't pay anything.

• **Pro Tip:** Sign up for a free-trial of the product if it's available, or ask the product owner to give you a review/sample piece. The latter technique is popular among fashion & gadget bloggers.

In a worst-case scenario, you can **buy and use the product** to come up with an educated review.

# Note: 60% of my affiliate sales come from reviews & tutorials related to the product.

When you are signing up for *any affiliate program*, here are the features that you should pay attention to:

- Available banners
- Promotional materials
- Affiliate control panel
- Minimum payout
- Payment method
- Tax form requirements

#### Things to keep in mind:

- Don't *limit yourself* to a specific network or program
- Some products may not have an affiliate program today, but it doesn't mean they will not have one later. Last year I used a growth hack method to earn \$1,200 in one month from affiliate marketing. This trick is perfect for anyone with an existing blog. You can read about it & watch the video here.

These things will help you to decide if you are ready to promote this product.

Suppose you select a seasonal product, and its minimum payout is \$1000. Are you sure you are going to get that many conversions in an off-season?

**Bonus Tip:** Associating with famous brands will be an added advantage to your affiliate marketing campaign.

# Top Affiliate Networks/Marketplaces

So now you understand the features and benefits of joining an affiliate marketplace. Let's look at the best affiliate networks that you can join today & start making money.

These networks are placed in order of my personal preferences & the ones that are working out the best for me. Some of them may have limited affiliate programs to promote, but don't **discard any based on that** criteria alone. The reason being:

 you only need one great product to promote in order to earn thousands of dollars (..if not millions).

#### ShareASale:

If you have attended an affiliate summit or watched affiliate summit videos, you might already know about them. This affiliate network was founded in 2000 & since then, it has paid out **millions of dollars** to their affiliates. They have a great list of affiliate programs for all types of niches.

Even though their interface is not as modern as others, you will have no problem understanding it.

ShareASale makes it easy for you to get started with affiliate marketing. If you want to know how a company offers an affiliate program on ShareASale, you should read their marketing guide. This will give you a kind of "backstage view" of the other side of affiliate marketing.

You can join the ShareASale program now & it usually takes 2-3 working days to get approval.

### CJ.com (Commission Junction):

CJ is one of the **oldest & most popular** affiliate marketplaces out there. You will **find tons of affiliate products** in all niche types. I use (and have been using) CJ for a few selected affiliate programs for many years.

This is one marketplace where you should be.

# Amazon's Affiliate Program:

Amazon has an affiliate program that you can join for free.

Since Amazon is a trusted place & they have **tons of products** from all niche types, the Amazon affiliate program can help you generate **more than a decent income.**

#### ClickBank:

ClickBank is another very popular marketplace for affiliate marketers. Here you will find **tons of offers** which you can join & promote.



# Find affiliate offers using affiliate search engine:

This particular trick will save you so much time & very few people know about this.

**Use oDigger** or **Offervault** to find affiliate offers:



You can use either of these two sites to find affiliate offers in *any niche*. They are like search engines for finding affiliate offers. They are *very useful* when you are working on a **new niche** & looking for high converting offers.

Affiliate marketplaces are the **best places to start**. You can browse your niche in these marketplaces and see top performing affiliate programs.

Alternatively, many **niche-based forums** are a *great place* to find new products to promote.

• **Pro Tip:** You should keep an eye on blogs in your niche and see which product(s) they are promoting and what methods they are using for promotion.

# Art of Promoting an Affiliate Product On Your Blog:

One of these days you're going to have to implement what you have learned & start promoting products.

Now, is the perfect time to get into action mode & learn the art of promoting a product on your blog.

Do remember, there are other ways of promotions (like PPC marketing, <u>Email</u> marketing, etc).

But for now, I will be focusing on promoting via blogs, and later on you can use any other method to **quadruplate** (new word!) your earnings.

At the end of this chapter, I will also be sharing **one mistake** which many innocent affiliate marketers are making & how to fix that mistake.

To start, let's learn the art of affiliate product promotion using your own blog.


# Review post:

Nothing beats a killer review post about a product to drive conversions via your affiliate link. A review article **introduces the product** to your blog readers, and at the same time, your opinions and experiences will help them to understand why they should be buying it.

There are a few things that you should *always remember* when writing a review post for your affiliate product:

- Reviews should be **honest**. Most of the time, people just focus on pros of the product and *ignore the cons*. An honest review should **show both the sides of the coin**.
- If you don't like writing, you can always hire a good writer to do the writing work for you. At the same time, you can take care of all other aspects of your online business.
- Don't forget to add product images.

- Write a review in a personal tone (first or second person). You will connect much faster with your audience. Remember, the person reading the review is only one person.
- Again, pick a product that you are using or are likely to use for yourself.
- Take advantage of **star ratings** in search engines to get a higher CTR for your reviews. You can use <u>WPRich Snippets Plugin</u> to add star ratings on your blog posts. Your results in SERPs will look like the below image:



# Blog post promotion:

A good technique is to use affiliate links inside your blog posts and then promote those posts. For this, you should always write *highly targeted posts*.

For example, write an article in a way that a user will be searching for **right before** they make a decision to buy something. Write posts based on a *buying-intent keyword*.

This will increase your sales by *at least* 200%.

#### **Examples:**

- Best [product name] (online)
- Best [product name] site

- Best [product name] website
- Best + product type + in (current year).
- Discount [product name]
- [Product name] coupon
- [Product name] coupon code
- [Product name] discount
- Buy [Product name]
- Buy [Product name] online etc.

#### Specific Post Title Examples:

- Which GoPro camera model should you buy for shooting underwater?
- How to save money on international flight bookings to Cancun?

Which brings us to....

#### **How-To Articles:**

A DIY kind of article **always** works great for affiliate product promotion.

If your product is technical or needs instructions to use it, you can write a tutorial guide on how to use it properly.

Such tutorials are not only handy, but it will also help **you to improve your search engine ranking**. "How-To" articles *always perform great* in search engines.

# **Use Coupon Codes:**

It's no surprise that people want to save money. Offering your readers the opportunity to save money is **one of the biggest marketing gimmicks ever created**.

Coupons are *almost the same* as "free". Whenever a customer is buying a product, and they see a coupon box, they search for "Product Name + coupon". I'm sure you've done the same. I do it all the time.

When you offer these coupons, you offer the customer the opportunity to save money while you earn your commission as an affiliate. Win-Win-Win!

Remember, your goal as an affiliate marketer is to **make the customer click on the affiliate link** or else the sale will not be counted as yours. So if you offer a coupon, *make sure users have to click on your link* and don't just list a coupon code.

If you've ever been on various coupon sites, they will always ask you to "Click to view coupon", "Click to go to the merchant site", and so on. The reason for this is so that the potential customer drops the cookie with the marketer's affiliate link, and hence earns a commission.

#### Use a WordPress Website & Trick to Increase Sales:

When it comes to selecting a blogging platform, you shouldn't look anywhere other than WordPress. This platform **powers 25% of the websites in the world**.

Do you know how many websites are in the world & how much 25% of that is?

Yes.... millions!

One of the reasons WordPress is preferable for creating a blog, a coupon site, or a general website is because it lets you do amazing things with a couple clicks.

For example, I'm going to share with you **one simple yet powerful trick** to **increase your sales** from *existing* blog posts.

Whether it's a review post or a coupon code post, your first goal is to get more **views on these posts**. Apart from on-page Search Engine Optimization (SEO), you should give more visibility to such affiliate posts by placing it as **a featured post** (the first post on your homepage).

It is a *very handy* feature of WordPress. You can stick *any blog post* on your blog's homepage. Here is how to do that:



In the Edit Post section, click on Visibility and put a check mark on "Stick this post to the front page".

I have tried this with a few pillar posts at ShoutMeLoud, and it **helped a lot** to increase my reader base.

# Use Banners on the Sidebar (with clear call to action):

When you are getting targeted organic traffic to your blog, banner advertisements work great.

For me, a great part of my conversions come from banner clicks. A prominent banner placement and technique is the real key. One of the **classic mistakes** that people usually do is *add too many banners*. This confuses the reader.

Follow this one rule of thumb:

#### Never place similar products' banners on your sidebar:

o Banner ads work as a **recommended product**, and with *multiple similar products*, you are confusing your readers as they now have to decide which product they want to buy. A good idea is to place **different related products** in a niche. For example, a WordPress

tips blog can place banner ads for: a theme, a plugin, and a hosting service together on the same sidebar.



If your blog is multi-niche, you should consider using the <u>Adrotate plugin</u> for your ad management. This plugin will help you to show ads **based on category** and/or **geographical location**. You can also run A/B testing of different banners.

**Bonus Tip:** When placing ads, link out to the website directly instead of to your review post. One big mistake many affiliate marketers are making is they try to link an ad to their review post or another internal post. This is wrong because a product landing page is always optimized for higher conversion. Though, if the product landing page is not of a high quality, you are better off educating users first with your review post.

# How Google Treats Affiliate Links For Search Engine Ranking

One of the primary concerns of most affiliate marketers is dealing with **affiliate links from an SEO perspective**.

One major way to make sure your *affiliate site grows* and **doesn't get penalized** due to affiliate links is by making sure you are **adding value** through your content.

An affiliate site should also be **properly promoted and maintained** like any other high-quality site.

I have a <u>web-hosting affiliate</u> site and most of the time, I have 1-2 affiliate links somewhere within a blog post. Somehow, with the recent <u>Panda update</u>, my traffic increased and now **it's ranking on the top 10 for many money-related keywords**. Lucky me, eh?

But to make sure Google doesn't penalize me for using affiliate links, I need take care of a few things.

As mentioned by Matt Cutts, head of Goggle's spam division, in most cases, Google handles affiliate links without any issue, as they know about the majority of affiliate networks. But if you are still worried, you can add a *no-follow link* to your affiliate links.

Now, if you are new to the "no-follow" term, you can learn more about it here:

Mow to add no-follow tag to a link.

# How to Deal with Affiliate Links, SEO in WordPress:

There are many free and paid affiliate plugins available. I have only played with a few of these WordPress\_affiliate plugins, but luckily I stumbled onto **one of the best** ones – *ThirstyAffiliates*.

In ThirstyAffiliate's settings, there is an option that lets you add a nofollow attribute to **all links cloaked using this plugin**. This will help you to stop passing "link juice" to affiliate links.

Also, I suggest you add the <u>ThirstyAffiliates URL trigger</u> in your <u>robots.txt</u> file as "disallow".

For example, my URL trigger for affiliate links are /recommended/ and in my WordPress robots.txt file, I have following lines:

- User-agent: \*
- Disallow: /recommended/

This is to make sure Google doesn't <u>crawl</u> such links, and your website is not penalized for any kind of affiliate linking penalty.

This is *only a solution for those who use the ThirstyAffiliates WordPress plugin.* For others, you should start adding the <u>no-follow</u> tag to such links.

For old posts, where you have used direct affiliate links, you can use the <u>Link Status Pro Plugin</u> to quickly add the "no-follow" attribute.

I suggest you use some kind of plugin like <u>ThirstyAffiliates</u> or another similar plugin to mask your affiliate links because default links look ugly and might lower your <u>CTR</u>.

(I have already explained to you the benefits of link cloaking in an earlier section, but it's an important thing to remember.)

# How You Can Effectively Increase Affiliate Sales

So how do you feel so far about these basic promotion tips? Some of the above ideas are *unspoken secrets*, but there are many more which A-list bloggers like Darren Rowse, John Chow, and, at times, Pat Flynn uses for promoting a product.

What I'm going to share now will likely **change your outlook towards making money from affiliate marketing**. Instead of looking it as a *quick money making scheme*, you will start seeing it as a way of "**living the life**".

Don't believe me? Well how do you think was I able to afford a \$300,000 apartment at the age of 29?



Affiliate marketing requires **serious marketing and networking skills**. One way to earn money is by staying invisible (density-less websites) and drive traffic through PPC, searches, and banners in order to make sales through non-blogging ways.

Another (and in my opinion *better*) way is to **create a blog**, share *useful* information, earn people's trust, and give them something that *they can't refuse*.

This sounds simple, but the road to becoming a **six-figure affiliate marketer** is not easy. However, in the process you will learn many, many things, which will help make it simpler as you go along.

Here are some tips that you can use *immediately* to help increase your affiliate sales.

# Build Up Your Reputation: Become an authority

Your **reputation** will be one of your **most useful tools** in your mission to make money online.

It's not that hard to conceptualize. **It's really just common sense**. If your audience trusts you and the material you give them, then it will be easier for them to trust the products you're selling or leading them into.

If you don't want to sell a product *yourself*, then you can just *lead them to other sites*, and simply make money by producing those leads.

But, again, **be aware of how this will impact your reputation**. Always be sure that you're leading your readers to a reliable site.

#### Tell Your Audience What To Do Next:

Remember that your readers are on your site **because of your site**, not because of the other sites that you are linking to.

Sometimes, even if you post a link here and there, you'll gain nothing out of them. Your readers will leave and you won't make money.

To effectively **increase affiliate sales**, you have to *tell your audience what to do next*. A good way to attract your readers into an affiliate's site is by slipping in the words "free" and "freebie" into your links.

Everyone (you and me both) loves freebies, and when your readers click on these intriguing links, your affiliate commissions will go through the roof.

# Drive Targeted Traffic Using SEO & PPC:

More traffic on your site will mean a better chance of selling more products with your affiliates.

It's an accepted rule that if you want to make money online, **you'll have to target people**. You have to build your site around the idea of *attracting your target audience*.

#### **Affiliate Marketing Handbook**

This is done by using keywords, creating quality content, and doing the *right kind* of marketing. This will result in having your site visible in search engines for **important keywords**.

Even if you're inexperienced with marketing affiliates, you'll soon find out that **more traffic** will make it easier for you to make **more money** with your links.

I suggest you use WordPress for creating your next affiliate site. When you do, you can refer to this **big list** of the <u>best WordPress plugins for SEO</u> and optimize your site for better search engine ranking.

#### **Base Your Actions Around Conversion Rates:**

When marketing affiliates, you will **always have to upgrade** consistently every week and, if possible, every day. You will need to base these actions around conversion rates.

For example, you have 300 visitors a day and only 3 of them click on your link or product. That means you'll have to change the way you market. Think from the customer's point of view.

Ask these questions to yourself:

- Does anything on my site make people want to click on a link or product? Branch off ideas from that.
- Does anything on my site make people **not want** to buy the linked product? Remove and avoid these things.

These are some of the basic steps that you can follow, but I would suggest you do **proper research** about the product(s) that you are promoting. Promoting a product in a hot, trending, and popular topic that people are buying instantly is usually a "go" for **viral promotion.** 

Marketing affiliates is all about **business strategy** and **engaging with your audience**. If you want to **increase affiliate sales**, you need to lead your audience into something that they will appreciate.

# How To Start Using ShareASale Affiliate Marketplace & Make Money

In this section, you will learn everything about ShareASale.

In the next 15 minutes you will be **all set to start earning** from this popular affiliate marketplace.

#### What is ShareASale & How Does it Work?

ShareASale was started in 2000 & it's a popular service for marketers to launch an affiliate program for their product or services.

Bloggers & affiliate marketers can find and join affiliate programs.


Marketers who plan to launch an affiliate program, can join them & use their Welcome Kit & training webinars to educate themselves.

Before I share the guide, you should know about these 4 terms (many of which we've already covered):

- **Merchants:** Merchants are *business owners* who set up an affiliate program so that affiliates can join & drive more sales to their business in return for a fixed commission.
- **Affiliate Marketers:** Users like me & you who join an affiliate program & promote it via a blog, PPC, or other methods.
- **Affiliate Software:** This could be self-hosted or a service like ShareASale, ClickBank, or CJ where an affiliate program is hosted. In this case, ShareASale is the affiliate software.
- **Affiliate Marketplace:** A marketplace where an affiliate can discover new opportunities & join an affiliate program. Similarly, a business gets to expose their affiliate program to affiliate marketers.

Now that you have a clear understanding of the basic terminology, let's learn how to use ShareASale's affiliate marketplace.

• Step 1: Head over to **ShareASale & signup for a free account.** 



Click "Move On To Step 2".

To create an affiliate account on ShareASale, you **need to have a website**. Even if you plan to promote an affiliate deal using PPC, <u>Google AdSense</u>, or any others, you **still need to have a website**.

If you don't have one at this moment, you can <u>follow this guide</u> & setup your website in the next 25 minutes.

In the above chapter, I have talked about you can earn money by ShareASale Marketplace. In this chapter, I'm going to talk about the Amazon affiliate program.

Amazon is one of the world's biggest marketplaces. Even though there are so many affiliate marketplaces in the world, many bloggers and big companies use Amazon to sell their products.

Their affiliate program pays you up to 15% of the sale amount and, depending on what kind of sale you are making, it's a good way to make big money.

This is especially true if you are a gadget or mobile blogger. You can write a complete review of a phone and give an Amazon affiliate link. By spending 15 minutes of your time and finding the best mobile deal, you can add substantial extra income.

# How to Sign up for Amazon Affiliate program?



Depending on your geographical location or your target market, you should signup for the Amazon affiliate program.

For example, if your target audience is in U.S., you should signup for Amazon U.S. associate Program using this link. If your target audience is from India, you should sign-up for Amazon India program. If you plan to promote products from all Amazon geographical location, you should sign up for Amazon affiliate program for all countries like .jp (Japan), au (Amazon Australia) & so on.

The possibilities are enormous and, depending on your niche, you can add links and monetize your site to a very large degree using Amazon.


You will be earning money from Amazon affiliate online when someone follows your Amazon referral link and buys something. That also includes further purchases.

Or simply browse Amazon site while logging into your Amazon affiliate link. On every page at the top, you can find amazon Affiliate link generator which will let you grab Amazon affiliate links instantly.

Once your application is approved, login to your Amazon affiliate panel & now head to any product page on Amazon website. At the top, you would see the option call Amazon Associates site stripe.




• Amazon doesn't pay you for a sale which is made on stores in a different country other than the one you have signed up for.

The concept of <u>Geni.us</u> is brilliant for any internet marketer & I really like the way they've made it easy for anyone to get started. The onboarding is simple & once you have created a trial account, you can straight away track how effective this service is going to be for you.










#### My Amazon Income Stats After Using Geni.us for 30 Days:





Well, Geni.is is indeed one such tool that every Amazon affiliate should use. Apart from affiliate marketing, you can also use it for various purposes. For example, you can use it to send users to different pages based on their device or geolocation.

The practical implementations are numerous & I'm pretty sure you will figure out a smart way to use this tool.

Alternative to Geni.us for Amazon Associates: There is a WordPress plugin called <u>Easy Azon</u> which is not as powerful as Geni.us, yet popular among marketers who are into the Amazon affiliate niche.

# Other Affiliate Marketplaces

#### ClickBank:



ClickBank is one of the **most popular affiliate marketplace**s out there, and a large hub for affiliate marketers. Joining ClickBank is easy, and once you are signed up, you will get your ClickBank user name (mine is – "denharsh").

Most of the premium WordPress affiliate program plugins are **managed by ClickBank** and you need to get the "hop link".

Here is a quick example:

The <u>Instabuilder plugin</u> is managed by ClickBank (CB), and on their affiliate page, you will see a link like:



# Affiliate or AdSense: Which is Better?

So far you have learned the affiliate marketing basics, you have a glossary of affiliate marketing terms, and you know all **the important elements** of an affiliate program.

You also know where to go to get good affiliate products to promote and market.

Now, if you are an experienced blogger that is *already monetizing* your blog with AdSense, you may be asking this question:

# Should I continue using AdSense or remove it altogether?

There's no right or wrong answer here. But there are a few important things to note.

Affiliate marketing is **more rewarding than AdSense** in terms of *revenue* & not loading up your site with un-moderated ads.

But the downside is it requires **more effort**.

With AdSense, you **simply place a code** & all money making from the blog is on auto-pilot. With blog-based affiliate marketing, **you need to churn out high quality content on a regular basis along with constantly working on finding quality products within a reputable affiliate program.** 

Since you have purchased this eBook, I'm assuming you are not lazy. But, if any of your friends are, you can tell them about <u>Viglinks</u> & <u>Skimlinks</u>. These are like <u>Infolinks</u> (in-text ads) and may help to generate more money than AdSense.

You can <u>read more about them here</u>.)

By not using Google AdSense, one can easily **clean the clutter** from his/her blog & make content more concise and readable. At the same time, by using affiliate marketing, you end up **earning more** while *keeping your readers happy*.

Now, let's have a detailed look at some of the **reasons why & scenarios** where affiliate marketing is *better* than AdSense.

At ShoutMeLoud.com, I don't use **any AdSense ads**, but on a few of my blogs such as *LetsTalkRelations.com*, I use *AdSense AND affiliate products*.

In my personal opinion, AdSense is good only when you are running a multiniche blog. But if there is a relevant product to your niche blog, affiliate marketing will be way more profitable.

Now, about my model:

I use **affiliate marketing banners** + **AdSense** + **direct advertisements** to monetize most of my blogs.

People have a common misconception that Google is against affiliate marketing. This is simply *not true*.

Google says **it's perfectly fine** to keep the affiliate links, but it's important to maintain the **quality of blog**. If you write sneaky and low-quality content and put **20** affiliate links into an article, this will surely affect your website's search engine ranking.

### Things to know- AdSense vs. Affiliate Marketing:

- It's **easier** to get into an affiliate network than AdSense.
- Affiliate marketing **pays higher** than AdSense.
- Most affiliate companies offer PayPal as a payment method;
  - o AdSense doesn't.
- You can find affiliate products for all niches, but AdSense is not allowed on certain niches.
- AdSense gives **recurring income** while *many* affiliates only pay once.
- Affiliate ads are **more attractive** whereas we don't have any personal control over ads shown by AdSense.

It's quite evident from the above points that affiliate marketing is **more** lucrative and beneficial than AdSense.

But, again I would suggest you experiment with both.

With one affiliate sale, you could be making somewhere between \$10-\$300 depending on the product that you are promoting.

In my case, *I can make a lot more money* with affiliate marketing than with AdSense.

# My Experiment of Replacing AdSense Ads with Affiliate Marketing:

When I wanted to move away from AdSense, it was scary. I wanted to replace it with affiliate banners, but at the same time I didn't wanted to lose my monthly recurring income from AdSense...

Finally, I took the leap of faith & did what I **should have done much sooner**.

I took away all prominent AdSense ad spots above my posts and replaced them with a banner for a product that I'm affiliated with.

You want to know the result of this experiment?

• 6 sales in 25 days which resulted in (6\*100) \$600

I was only making **\$280/month** with AdSense.

But let me tell you the **most important thing**. I'm not saying that you should not use AdSense. I'm saying that you should *decide your blog monetization methods based on your niche & audience*.

Here at ShoutMeLoud, I have a smart audience who understands the internet & knows what to click and what not to.

On ShoutMeTech.com, which is targeted to tech-enthusiast people who want to read about the latest tech gadgets, that audience doesn't mind seeing ad banners that are offered by AdSense, Media.net & similar advertising platforms. They don't care about internet marketing like we do.

In simple words:

Note: Affiliate marketing works best when you have a niche website with a highly targeted audience.

# Can You Have Amazon Affiliate Ads and AdSense on the Same Page?

Here I'm using the example of the Amazon affiliate program, but this is **true for** all other affiliate programs. Amazon Associates just happens to be one of the most popular affiliate programs. But you can replace Amazon with any other affiliate program.

Newbies tend to worry about using affiliate links on the same page where they are showing AdSense ads.

They fear this might get their account banned...

Well, let's find out how true this is:

The short answer is, "Yes, you can place affiliate ads along with AdSense ads on the same page, and this doesn't violate AdSense policies." Here is a screenshot from the official AdSense help page, which clearly says: "We do allow affiliate or limited-text links."

# Using other ad networks together with AdSense

We have some guidelines as to how non-Google ads may be displayed along with Google ads. We do allow affiliate or limited-text links.

If your ad network already displays Google ads on your pages, you can still join AdSense and run ads on your site through our program. We allow publishers to display up to three standard Google ad units on any webpage.

Keep in mind that it's your responsibility to work out any contractual issues that may arise with your ad network as a result of serving Google ads directly.

To add more to it, here is what you need to know about using any other ad network with AdSense. Here is an excerpt from the official AdSense help page:

(Note: Affiliate ads are called "different advertising networks" here.)

#### Google ads on the same page with other ads

You're welcome to display Google ads on the same site or page as other third party advertisements provided that the formatting or colors of the third party ads is different enough from that of the Google ads. In other words, if you choose to place non-Google ads on the same site or page as Google ads, it should always be clear to the user that the ads are served by different advertising networks and that the non-Google ads have no association with Google. If the formats are naturally similar, we ask that you choose different color schemes for the competing ads.

Our intent with this policy is to be as fair to our advertisers as possible and to maintain the integrity of the AdWords and AdSense programs. You can learn more about this, and all our policies, on our program policies page. Please also be aware that competitor ads are considered to be part of your site's content and must follow our policy guidelines.

Before you jump for joy and start adding tons of affiliate banner ads and link ads on your blog, here are a few important things that you need to know:

- If the number of ads or affiliate banners/links is more than the original content, this will put your AdSense account in danger. Limit the number of ads on your blog, and focus on adding value and quality to your website. I suggest you to keep an "optimum limit" of ads that you place on your blog, and only place them in a way which doesn't hamper user-experience.
- Your affiliate ads should not link to content which is not allowed in AdSense's TOS. Ex: Adult content. AdSense treats other ads (ads from other ad networks or affiliate ads) on a page as part of the content and all of that content should follow their content guidelines.
- While using affiliate links on your blog, make sure they are "no-follow". This has nothing to do with AdSense, but using the no-follow tag is a good practice from an SEO point of view (& also recommended by Google).

### **Summing It Up:**

To sum it up: Yes, you can use affiliate ads with Google AdSense on your website.

But I would recommend you start using affiliate marketing **in addition** to AdSense.

If you have an existing blog, a good idea is to replace **one of your low performing ad units** with *direct affiliate ads* of a product related to your niche.

Once you start getting success in the form of affiliate sales, replace more AdSense ad blocks with affiliate ads. If you select the *right product to promote*, you can easily earn (at a *minimum*) **2-3X of your AdSense earnings** with affiliate marketing.

Note: <u>Amazon has just launched Native Shopping Ads</u> (which are compatible with AdSense).

# CPA Vs. Affiliate Marketing: The Beginner's Guide To CPA Marketing

CPA is considered to be **easier** than affiliate marketing for one simple reason:

• You get paid for **sending** a lead.

Once the traffic you send converts into a lead, it becomes the job of the particular network to convert that lead into a sale. Whether or not that sale gets made, you will **still be paid for the lead**.

In CPA, you get paid for sending users who complete an action that could be as simple as getting a user to fill out a form or take any other desired action.

In affiliate marketing, you get paid when somebody makes a purchase.


In short, it's much easier to get a user to do something that doesn't cost money.

# How's it different from affiliate marketing?

Here are some more differences between CPA & affiliate marketing:

- You get paid fast in a CPA network.
- You are usually on your own in a CPA network. In an affiliate network, you are assigned an affiliate manager who guides you towards the best offers & shares ways to help you make more money.
- Once you are part of an affiliate network like ShareASale, ClickBank, or any other, you can quickly get affiliate links and start promoting. With CPA, it takes a much longer time to become part of a network & you need to get approval for the CPA offer that you wish to promote.

Here is a screenshot of my **Peerfly** dashboard (a popular CPA Network):



### FAQ about CPA:

### Should you use CPA or affiliate marketing?

One benefit of CPA is it usually converts well (because no direct sale needs to be made) & you can drive traffic from various sources.

At the same time, the downside of CPA in comparison to affiliate marketing is that (because no direct sale is being made) it pays less.

The rule of thumb to making online income is:

• Don't *limit yourself* to one form of making money online.

For a beginner, it's good to start with CPA as you might not have a blog or a consistent source of traffic.

With CPA, you can see **immediate results** as you will start seeing a few cents in your account when users take simple actions like submitting their email into a form.

### How much money can one earn with CPA?

There are people who are *making millions* with CPA marketing.

But in terms of single conversions, it could be as low as \$0.10 and as high as \$10. In some cases when the user has to **enter their credit card** details for a trial of a product, you can get paid **up to \$50**.

### How about traffic generation methods?

In CPA, you need to check the promotion details before starting the promotion. Many CPA offers are **limited to certain geographical locations** & sometimes you can use only *selected sources* to drive traffic.

Below you can see a screenshot of one offer where the only allowed country is France & there are specific allowed & not allowed traffic generation methods.

(Again, taken from the Peerfly CPA network.)

### How about reversal & holding periods for commission payouts?

In affiliate marketing, we have a **holding period of 30-60 days** whereas in CPA you get **paid instantly** with *no refunds* unless you are violating the TOS such as driving traffic from an illegal method.

You will be paid **once you reach the minimum payout** for the CPA network you are signed up with.

#### How about scam offers?

This is one of the **biggest downsides of CPA**.

You will find **a lot of scam offers** paying \$1-\$2 for simple tasks.

Like this one where you need to drive traffic to a "win an iPhone/iPad" page:



But I'm sure you are smart enough to know such offers are scams & something you don't want people to fall for. Avoid offers such as "make money quickly", online flash games (many of them install spyware), sex or dating sites, and many others that seem sketchy.

Use your own judgment & avoid promoting something that looks overly scammy or might hurt somebody.

In my opinion, **both affiliate marketing & CPA** are a *great source* of earnings online.

Affiliate marketing is the **slow process**, but with the right strategy, it offers a **much larger payout** in the long run.

At the same time, CPA **is easy for beginners** without a website as you only need to send traffic to take simple actions like email signups or installing an app or completing a survey.

# How To Start Making Money With Web-Hosting Affiliate Programs:

Web-hosting affiliates are one of the **most lucrative** and one of the **highest paying** affiliate programs available.

There are many people out there who are making **thousands of dollars** from commissions by selling and promoting different web-hosting companies such as <u>HostGator</u>, <u>GoDaddy</u>, <u>DreamHost</u>, <u>Bluehost</u>, etc.

These are **not the only hosting companies** that are providing affiliate options; almost *all hosting companies* offer affiliate programs.

If your blog is about "how to blog", "how to start a website" or is based around the blogging niche, *web-hosting affiliates* **will always** help you to *earn more* than what you are earning from AdSense or any other ad network.



Here we will look at some of the reasons *why web-hosting affiliate programs* can help you make **a lot of money** and some of the affiliate programs that you can join today.

# Why Web-Hosting Affiliate Programs?

### **High commission payout:**

Hosting affiliate programs offer **insane commissions** to those who bring in new sales. For example, HostGator pays a **minimum of \$50 commission** for each sale.

They have an *inverted pyramid* system where the more sales you make in a month, the higher the commission is for each sale. It can go up to \$125 a sale if you get 21+ sales a month.

You might be thinking, "**How can these companies afford to pay these insane commissions?**" This is *exactly* what I thought when I first heard about these commissions.

Then I went through some literature from some of these hosting companies and realized their business plans are *actually pretty good*.

They feel that if someone registers for a new hosting plan with them, these companies are so confident about their services that they will be able to hold on to the customer for years to come. Over time, they end up making much more and can afford an affiliate's \$50 commission.

### Increase in popularity of building websites:

There is **way more** interest in designing and building websites these days than there was 10 years ago. So **the market is there**, and all you need to do is make sure that you can attract this market to **buy through you**.

This can be accomplished by **good SEO**, **good use of coupons** (more on this in a moment), and proper promoting through **social networks**.

With so many new people everyday wanting to build websites (**who also need hosting**), there is a **huge market** of people for affiliate marketers to target. If you have some corresponding articles and information, *there is no doubt* that you will bag some good commissions each month.

### **Suggested Niches for Web-Hosting Affiliates:**

Don't think that you need to have a domain name like *HostingReviews.com* or *HostingDiscounts.com* and write **only about hosting topics** to earn

commissions from hosting companies. There are many other niches that will give you good results as well.

Here are some niche ideas:

- Technology
- Blogging
- Mow to Create/Design Websites
- Coding Tips
- WordPress/Blogger Tutorials
- Templates Blog

These are just **some of the topics**, which have a good potential to get hosting commissions.

You will not believe it when I say that I got my **first two commissions** from HostGator through a personal blog and an education blog. Even today I am dumbfounded how that happened, but as I said your **niche does not have to about hosting**.

The point is that you earn a really high **fixed commission** unlike Adsense or Chitika, which depends on your niche and pays according to keywords.

# **Hosting Discount Coupons:**

Most of the hosting affiliates provide custom coupon codes for you. If someone buys a hosting plan using those coupons, you will get a commission.

• **Pro Tip**: If possible, make your codes **very simple and easy to remember**.

Market these codes on your blog and *clearly state* the discounts they offer. If you use your coupons well, you can **earn a lot more** than with any CPC or CPM platform.

Coupons give an *incentive* for users to go and buy a hosting plan for their website.

With hosting companies providing so many opportunities, with just a *little hard work* you can surely earn a lot from hosting commissions.

Make use of this high paying type of affiliate. You will not regret it.

### Popular Web-Hosting Affiliate Programs:

Now, there are **many web-hosting companies** that you can pick from and join their affiliate programs.

In most cases, joining a web-host's affiliate program is free, and I will also share how you can find an affiliate program for **any web-host**. You can also use affiliate marketplaces like <u>CJ</u> and <u>ClickBank</u> to find many high-paying web-hosting affiliate programs.

### But, I prefer joining hosting affiliates directly.

Some of the suggested ones are: <u>HostGator</u>, <u>Bluehost</u>, and <u>GoDaddy</u>.

But don't try to jump into every hosting affiliate network. Pick the affiliate of the hosting company which you are using and are confident about.

For example, at ShoutMeLoud, you will notice under "Suggested Web-Hosting", there are three programs and all of them are **personally used by the team** here at SML.

Again, it's always **wise** to suggest something that you are confident about and convinced is worthwhile.

You can always use the Google search trick that I have shared in the previous section to find the affiliate registration page for **any hosting company** you want to work with.

• **Pro Tip:** I would recommend you work with only those web-hosting companies who are well-known & reliable. Working with trustworthy companies has **two major** benefits- their products are proven to be great and conversion rates for their affiliates are typically **much higher** than less well-known companies.

# List of Best Recurring Affiliate Programs:

One of the **highly profitable moments** of affiliate marketing is when you find an affiliate that offers recurring income.

I'm assuming by now you are aware of how affiliate marketing works. Basically, you get paid when somebody buys a product using your affiliate link & you get a commission.

But one thing to keep in mind is that there are *many affiliate programs* which pay you a **recurring income**.

This is one way for you to earn money on autopilot. You will keep making money as long as your referred users stay with the company. Of course, quality of the product (again) plays a major role, as nobody will stick to a product or a brand which is not of high quality. This is why companies offer recurring commissions; they have a lot of trust in their own product.

Now, I'm *not saying that recurring income is better* than a single affiliate payout because both have their own pros and cons.

Let me explain recurring affiliate commissions in a very simple way.

### What is a recurring affiliate commission?

When you recommend a user to any product (usually a membership program or multiple-time product) which requires a recurring monthly payment, you will earn **another commission** when a referred user **pays their next bill**.

Some companies offer recurring commissions for a *fixed time* (e.g. one year) & other companies offer the same commissions for a *lifetime*.

It all depends upon the company's marketing policies.

In this chapter, I will share some of the **best available affiliate programs which offer recurring commissions** & could potentially **be a gold mine** for you & your affiliate marketer friends.

So, let's have a look at these exclusive programs which will make money for you while you sleep.


This works out really well for a marketer when referred users signup for their monthly billing cycle.

Getting users onboard is easy as they offer a free 30-day trial, which is usually compelling enough for users to give it a shot.

And let me tell you, **you won't be disappointed** with their email marketing solution. They have everything you need in a *modern* email marketing service for your business to function properly.

Anyway, an affiliate lifetime commission of 30% sounds like a win-win to me.

The only **downside is their payment method.** They still offer the old-school paper check & have yet to integrate any new-school payment methods.

### **GetResponse**

GetResponse is one of the top competitors & alternatives to Aweber.

They **also** have a great product & even have a *slight* edge over Aweber when it comes to commission amount.

They offer **33% lifetime commission** which is *awesome* as it's even better than the industry standard. They also offer a **30-**day completely free trial.



### More residual income programs:

("Residual income" is another name for **recurring income** where you earn passive income with no more required effort.)

Here are some more affiliate programs which offer residual income that you can sign up for right away.

(Since you are smart, you should always go & read about the product & affiliate information on the site itself.)

- Snip.ly: 20% recurring commission
- <u>LiquidWeb</u>: 5% monthly recurring commission on dedicated hosting
- RoseHosting: 50% first month sale + 20% monthly commission on VPS hosting.
- Shopify Affiliate Program: 20% recurring income

(I will keep updating the list as I discover more such profitable programs in various niches.)

# FAQ About Affiliate Marketing:

So there it is. Now you have a basic understanding of what affiliate marketing is, how it works, and how you can make money from it.

Now, let me answer some of the most commonly asked questions from webmasters and marketers related to affiliate marketing.

### Is affiliate marketing harmful or illegal?

-No, it's not. You are simply providing a link to another site. Nothing illegal there.

### Affiliate marketing and AdSense: Can we use both?

-Yes, you can. Affiliate marketing alone doesn't violate the AdSense TOS.

### How do you find affiliate links for a specific product?

- -Not all companies offer affiliate programs, but for companies who do offer affiliate programs, you can always check their website or FAQ page. Another way is to do a simple Google search. For example, search the following term in Google:
  - "Product name + Affiliate program" Replace "product name" with the product you are promoting, and you will hit an affiliate landing page.

Many companies use affiliate marketplaces like *ShareASale, CJ, and ClickBank*. They are free to use and you can go ahead and create a free account.

### Is it important to have a blog for affiliate promotion?

-Not necessarily. Though, having a blog (in my opinion) is the best way to promote your affiliate links. But you can always use things like paid traffic (PPC) or advertising to promote an affiliate product. However, this is more like a "hit and run" approach to affiliate marketing. The best way to *make the most* out of being an affiliate marketer is to have a blog that's used for hard and soft promotion.

### How much does it cost to join an affiliate program?

There is no charge for joining an affiliate program. However, costs can occur depending on what promotion technique you are using. For example, a blog post

doesn't cost a dime, whereas PPC marketing, email marketing, or other advertising methods come with a price tag.

### What are the qualifications to become an affiliate marketer?

There are no qualifications required to become an affiliate marketer. However, having good *copywriting* and *marketing skills* will be an *added advantage*.

# Are there any programs which automatically convert links into affiliate links?

There are a few networks (like <u>Viglink</u> and <u>Skimlinks</u>) which automatically convert normal links into affiliate links. Since they are using Javascript, it's SEO friendly. With these links, you do not need to sign up for an individual affiliate program.

### How much money one can make from affiliate marketing?

There is *no limit* to the amount you can earn from affiliate programs. It all depends on which program(s) you are promoting and how many conversions you are making. I started with \$47 as my first affiliate income and now, I make almost \$4k-\$5K/month simply by promoting products that I use everyday.
